#### Dear TY Readers,

Cannabis is illegal in Canada, with an exception if you are a registered medical user with Health Canada. I constantly hear from individuals all over the world believing anyone is safe to "toke up" in our beautiful country. Sure, our law enforcement is less aggressive when seeing a few harmless folks self-medicating or recreationally smoking, but it is at their discretion on whether to issue a warning, arrest you, confiscate or even impose a financial fine. Recently, half a dozen cannabis dispensaries were raided by police in eastern Canada, leaving thousands upon thousands of responsible adults without their life-saving medicine. Procuring marijuana from the streets is not only dangerous but potentially harmful when you have no knowledge of the product being consumed. Canadians must force their government to legalize marijuana - plain and simple. Health Canada recently released a statement clarifying their rules regarding clubs after the unnecessary arrests of these courageous owners and staff. I advise everyone to get involved and end the insanity.

#### Health Canada's Statement on Medical Marihuana Compassion Clubs

2010-94 June 7, 2010

#### For immediate release

OTTAWA - Health Canada would like to provide information regarding the Marihuana Medical Access Regulations (MMAR) as they relate to organizations such as "compassion clubs" or "cannabis dispensaries". Under the MMAR, Health Canada does not licence organizations such as "compassion clubs" or "cannabis dispensaries" to possess, produce, or distribute marihuana for medical purposes. Under the MMAR, only individuals can be authorized by Health Canada to possess and/or be licensed to produce marihuana for medical purposes. As well, Health Canada is the only organization that can legally supply marihuana seeds and dried marihuana for medical purposes to such individuals.

It has been reported that patients could purchase marihuana for medical purposes from compassion clubs provided they have documentation from Health Canada or a registered physician. This could mislead patients to believe that they are authorized to possess marihuana if they have a letter, or other documentation, from a physi-

cian, which is not accurate.

It is also incorrect that organizations such as compassion clubs or cannabis dispensaries are legally able to sell or provide marijuana to those who have authorization from Health Canada to possess marihuana for medical purposes.

The only way that individuals can be legally authorized to possess marihuana for medical purposes is to apply to Health Canada under the MMAR. This application includes a declaration of support from their medical practitioner. Once authorized, there are only three options for individuals to obtain a legal supply of dried marihuana: 1) access Health Canada's supply of dried marihuana; 2) obtain a license from Health Canada to produce for themselves; or 3) obtain a license from Health Canada to designate someone to produce on their behalf.

Under the MMAR, holders of a production licence can produce marihuana for a maximum of two individuals who have authorizations from Health Canada to possess marihuana for medical purposes. In addition, the maximum number of production licences (either personal-use or designated-person) at one site is four.

Individuals who disregard the requirements of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act and its regulations, or the terms and conditions of their authorization to possess and/or their licence to produce, could be subject to law enforcement measures.

Additionally, if compassion clubs operate outside of Canadian laws, this is an enforcement issue and falls under the jurisdiction of law enforcement agencies. Under the MMAR, Health Canada is authorized to communicate information to Canadian police agencies, in the course of an investigation, that enables them to confirm whether a named individual or specified address is associated with an authorization to possess or licence to produce marihuana for medical purposes.

## An open letter to Colorado about MMI



Dear fellow Coloradans, (and by extension, the rest of this great nation),

This is a letter to implore all people to finally look at cannabis for what it is. It is medicine, it is helpful, it is natural, and it is here to stay. It is non-addictive (in the chemical dependence sense), and it is far less toxic (not to mention less addictive) than nicotine, alcohol, or even aspirin and ibuprofen. Not only does it help ease pain and muscle spasticity, increase appetite and relaxation, it also seems to help with anxiety, mild depression (dysthymia) and mild to medium ADD.

Cannabis is not a harmful substance, especially when compared to other drugs. Please do not believe the propaganda that started in the 1930s and continues even today that cannabis (no longer should it be called "marijuana" or pot!) is a gateway drug, or that it leads to schizophrenia or other psychoses. These types of dispensaries perhaps seek ways to maximize profits with little concern for following the rules, or at best, positively impacting the advancement of cannabis as true medicine. Shame on them. These dispensaries will not last, no matter what the regulations. True medicinal users will not tolerate such shops. They will speak with their wallets.

As a dispensary owner and caregiver, I see hundreds of people walk through our doors every week. They are people suffering from all kinds of diseases and disorders, afflictions such as MS, Cancer, Crohn's Disease, fibromyalgia, CFIDS, glaucoma and bizarre stomach/gut disorders. The average age of our customers is over 40. Many have been in car accidents, their spines and other bones broken and held together with pins. Some have mysteriously disintegrating joints and limbs. Some have become addicted to prescription drugs containing opiates and benzodiazapines. They tell us they are finally sleeping through the night and taking fewer pills because the cannabis helps that much! Once again: these are not people who are just seeking to get high. Even if they were, at least they'd be using a completely benign medicine. Is hydrocodone benign? Is Percocet benign? Are drugs like Adderal, and Ritalin, or ones like Xanax and Ativan benign? If you care to know the truth, and if you dare, ask patients who have been taking prescription "painkillers" for years about the horrors of being





addicted to them.

Can we talk about chronic pain? Do you, fair reader, know what it is like to live in chronic pain? Can you wrap your head around what it's like to live every day of your life in unending pain and suffering? Those of you who know, know. We have customers at our dispensary who are so far into chronic pain that they use cannabis ONLY to help with the severe withdrawal effects of the opiates and other pain meds they are on. Does the cannabis ease their pain? In many cases, yes, although responses vary according to the causes and severity of the pain. But does the cannabis enhance a patient's quality of life by helping him/her take fewer types or quantities of other strong medications, or get a decent night's sleep? Undoubtedly. Day after day in our dispensary we hear our customers tell of improved quality of life resulting from cannabis.

Please do not presume to judge those who enter dispensaries. Please do not presume to assume that because they might look young or aren't in wheelchairs that they are not legitimate patients seeking compassionate care and relief for what ails them, and please do not forget that they have been recommended to try cannabis by licensed physicians. These are in all cases private matters between doctors and patients. Remember, too, that many pains and conditions are "invisible" in the sense that the observer cannot see or even guess something is wrong. Injury and pain and do not discriminate by age, gender or lifestyle.

Can we talk about the 16 year-old girl who comes into our dispensary who has Leukemia? She has no hair, and about as much hope. She still smiles, though. It's her parents who are truly suffering. They will try anything to ease the suffering of their daughter. Does cannabis make her feel better? I think so, but you'll have to ask her. Should she and her folks be allowed to purchase something (anything) that helps ease her pain, helps her feel better? Do you think that these

people should be able to choose what, where, when, and how they purchase cannabis and cannabis-infused products? I do. In fact, so did the voters in Colorado when they approved the legal use of cannabis for those with certain conditions. It is their choice, their privilege, and their constitutional right.

Be compassionate. Every day in my dispensary I meet people who are suffering with illness and pain. Some tell me they are dying. I consider it an honor to help in easing their pain. What if one of them was you or your child or your parent? Would you hesitate to help ease their pain or suffering in any way possible?

Can we talk about the politicians and law enforcement agencies here in Colorado (and elsewhere, too)? Representatives Massey and Summers, McCann, Rice, Labuda, Kagan, Pommer, along with Senators Romer and Spence, put forth House Bill 1284 and it has since passed and become law. Boy, oh boy did these guys get it wrong! In an attempt to "regulate" our fast-growing industry they have created a monstrosity of a law. Trying to make sense of this law is like trying to make sense of the U.S. tax codes. The law is an attempt to control something that was unsettling to some but was not illegal, and worse, it has nothing to do with the will and welfare of the voters.

The worst part of this entire lawmaking process was that these "pubic servants" did not consult the patients. They made no attempt to form a multifaceted, unbiased group of smart people to simply analyze, discuss and debate the issue. What they did instead was ignore, suppress and push out the caregivers, dispensary owners, and, worst of all, the patients. Keep in mind that those of us in this industry were generally "for" some sort of regulation. But we were not asked for our opinions, or our help. Are we as citizens and voters to assume that was fitting and proper, that this is how the lawmaking process should be? >

As a result of the new law, I believe we will see a very strong return to the black market. It's the old "one step forward, two steps back." The "growers of old" will ditch their attempts to be legal (which were actually working!) and return to selling their medicine illegally to their friends or even strangers. This is bad for both cops and growers. The cops know it, the growers know it, and now the patients will begin to know it. By trying to regulate medical cannabis, the state government has actually created more problems than ever existed before. For example, our state government just got a lot bigger with the creation of a whole new department inside of the Department of Revenue. It will cost millions to create and administer, and will create a huge new bureaucracy. The money that the state is receiving from the medical marijuana registry is now being allocated to this new department for the salaries and operating costs therein. Also, in my opinion, this newly-created department will put far too much power (and cash!) in the hands of those who might abuse it most. I predict the new regulatory agency will be rife with corruption and graft!

Next, this new law will put out of business many people who are not criminals, who are not "faking it" and who have just as much right to start a new business as anyone else. I believe that laws should not create criminals where there weren't any before. I believe laws should protect freedoms and safety and respect the will of the voters.

Furthermore, forcing a "Medical Marijuana Center" to grow 70 per cent of the meds it sells will not only destroy the small-batch boutique growers, but it will limit the diversity and quality of the medical cannabis available to those who need it, and that is certainly not in the interest of the patients. Some of the best medicine comes from these small operations. I look at it as akin to farmer's markets selling locally-grown organic foods, profiting the small business instead of the producers of genetically-modified crops like Conagra, Monsanto and the product-gentrification of Wal-Mart. These companies take no responsibility, insisting that the destruction of bio-diversity, top-soil and the overall decrease in public health are just collateral damages in the quest for profits. I argue that this new law promotes the same paradigm.

Lastly, the state and local governments are effectively hurting themselves by limiting the job growth and tax revenues of such a potentially large industry. The politicians talk endlessly about the need for new jobs but at the same time they are choking off potential new tax revenues and actually putting honest citizens out of work. Our federal, state and local governments are struggling with debts and budget cuts. Meanwhile, libraries and recycling centers are being shut down for lack of funds. Are we to close our libraries and cut school funding while simultaneously cutting off new tax revenues available from people who are generally happy to pay tax on cannabis? Locally, our Fourth of July celebration has been canceled due to budget cuts. Perhaps it would interest you to know that our dispensary alone sends over \$7,000 in sales tax revenue to our state and local governments every month. Imagine that multiplied by 100? 500? 1000?


I urge you to think of cannabis as an innocuous herbal medicine that offers profound relief and tremendous help to many people. I beg you to stop generalizing about those who use it or sell it or grow it. I especially urge you to vote out any politicians and council members who don't at least have open minds on the subject, those who are ignorant and afraid and who don't seek out the real opinions of those in their constituencies. If our lawmakers don't demonstrate compassion for those in need, our country is in trouble. Please do not trust the newspapers or TV news (especially The Denver Post, Fox News, et al). Their reporting is consistently reactionary and biased. They are propagating the same lies that have been going around for decades. They are neither talking nor listening to the patients and caregivers, the ones most effected by these laws. Do they care? I ask you to act and vote with wisdom and compassion.

Truthfully, cannabis' efficacy for problems both physical and mental may not yet be shown with full scientific backing, but its use has proved beneficial to countless medically-referred patients. It is clearly time that our state and local governments, along with the feds, support and fund research into cannabis for ailments. We, the dispensary owners, caregivers and patients are already fighting this good fight, and finding that cannabis is a heavyweight contender. Thankfully, new research is being done and new studies conducted (mostly in other countries) that show promising results, but we have a long way to go. More research is needed.

Please keep your minds and hearts open, do your own research as needed and ask people who are using cannabis for medicinal reasons what they think. Here are some great places to start:



At the release of my book at the last Cannabiz fair in Cologne, Germany in 2005, I noticed hash presses that we used in Mexico in the '60s being sold as if new innovations - made in Holland. The whiff of limburger cheese overwhelmed me.

The only person who has spoken to me truthfully been Werner Bruining, so I have included some photos from his guidebook for flashes back in cannabis history.

Recently, I interviewed an MS patient. His granddaughter had been supplying him with Cali red bud, which he liked and

The medical grower claimed that he had 14 years experience growing medical cannabis. In Oregon, we have 14 year olds with 5 generations' growing experience. It seems as if the Dutch Government wants cannabis to stay illegal and they be the only supplier of medical cannabis on the planet. I handed the legislators, 25 in all, my hand-out and

answer to Bedrocan BV, which clarified a few issues and infuriated the Dutch, who left with their tails between their legs.

Last summer, I grew a pure Afghan indica from seeds brought back from the war. That pure strain was real medicine. I have found that the original medical strains are the best medicine, and not the concoctions being produced today. The golden age of medical cannabis was 1840 to 1940, when legal farms produced massive amounts of medical cannabis for pharmaceutical industry. Farmers grew millions of plants and selectively bred for medicine. Give me those seeds.

Who do you want to buy seeds from? A Nigerian witch doctor, whose seeds have been handed down for thousands of years and used as medicine, or some seed bank-offered, GMO'd, feminized, auto-flowering strains that are painted with anti-pathogens and root stimulators — a well-known Dupont process for genetically engineered plants that have lost natural resistance to disease due to genetic modification. The Dutch hope to turn the cannabis seed industry into the tulip model. Cannabis is not chocolate, and this is not the 16th century.

On top of that, you have Hortapharm selling off strains to GW Pharmaceuticals, who now claim those strains as their intellectual property — when the seeds were collected illegally, since cannabis is illegal worldwide. It's harder to find pure strains due to Skunk being introduced worldwide in order to confuse origin. All the seed banks could be infringing on what is GW Pharmaceuticals intellectual property. As well, I wonder how governments like Thailand, Columbia, Mexico and Afghanistan feel about that...

They made mother nature's healing plants illegal and have been selling us chemical concoctions ever since. \$800 for an Oxycontin prescription in the US, when the same morphine is pennies to produce. They tell you dandelions are weeds, create Roundup that turns male frogs into females, when the truth is that the dandelion is one of mother nature's healing plants. ## Court Dismissed Charges of Cultivation of Marijuana

SAN DIEGO - In another resounding defeat for San Diego District Attorney Bonnie Dumanis and her fierce fight against medical marijuana in San Diego, the Honorable Judge Frederick Maguire June 21, 2010 in Superior Court dismissed charges of cultivation of marijuana in the case of People v. Benjamin Gasper.

Mr. Gasper was charged with felony cultivation and possession of marijuana in November of 2009 after the San Diego Police found a warehouse where he and two other medical cannabis patients were collectively cultivating marijuana for their own medical purposes.

Bahar Ansari took on Mr. Gasper's case months ago, at practically no cost and has worked tirelessly to provide him with superb representation and has been a true advocate against a DA's office that for years now has been at the forefront of trying to overturn Proposition 215 and the will of California voters.

Read the details of Mr. Gasper's arrest here: http://nugmag.com/2010/05/benjamin-gasper/ In March of 2010, at the preliminary hearing in Mr. Gasper's case, Bahar Ansari called to the stand both collective members who testified that they all got together in October of 2009 and signed a Collective Agreement, which stated; "As qualified medical marijuana patients under California law, we choose to associate collectively or cooperatively to cultivate marijuana for medical purposes. All members of our medical marijuana collective will contribute labor, funds, or materials, and all will receive medicine."

During a court recess at that day in March, in a surprising move, the prosecution offered Mr. Gasper a plea deal. Mr. Gasper however, refused the offer, and Ms. Ansari proceeded to present the case.

Judge W. Krauel that day decided that day to bind the case over for trial, even though the testimony of both patients proved that this was a legal collective of patients cultivating their own medication. At the hearing we heard Narcotics Detectives saying that they believed he was a "caregiver" therefore they decided to arrest and charge him.

Mr. Gasper and his attorney Ms. Ansari did not give up, they quickly filed a request for a hearing to review the decision Judge Krauel made in March, and today, after having reviewed all the evidence, and having heard all the arguments from both the defense and the District Attorney's office, Judge McGuire dismissed the cultivation charge against Mr. Gasper.

Ms. Ansari, following the ruling said "Judge Maguire in Department 53 granted our motion based on my argument that the preliminary hearing Judge failed to weigh the evidence, make any credibility findings, or assess any of the evidence that was presented at the conclusion of the hearing. He stated that he felt the credibility findings and weighing of evidence was an issue for the Jury. Today, Judge Maguire read transcript, heard my arguments, and agreed that Jugde Krauel did not carry out his duty of weighing the evidence; therefore Judge Maguire dismissed the cultivation charge." When asked how she felt about the judge's decision, Ms. Ansari said "I feel elated. I've been told that this Judge hardly ever grants these types of motions. I went in there today thinking that he absolutely should grant it and if he wasn't going to do it, I was already planning on appealing it. When he did grant it, I was absolutely and delightfully shocked."

In explaining what kind of message today's decision would send to the San Diego DA's office, she explained, "I hope that the message it sends to them is that they should not be wasting resources on persecuting medical marijuana patients. That is my hope. But given their conduct in the last few months, after the Jovan Jackson trial for example, they filed a new case against him, and based on statements from representatives of the DA's office since then, it would appear that they haven't stopped. The ruling in this case, however, was based more on the preliminary hearing Judge's error in failing to weigh the evidence. The judge entirely failed to carry out his duty, to do exactly what he is supposed to do during a preliminary hearing.

"I would advise patients to follow the law and the Attorney General's guidelines to the best of their ability. At the same time, that is exactly what many people have done who have nonetheless been prosecuted by the San Diego District Attorney. So, I say that with a caveat, that this won't necessarily protect them from prosecution. If they are prosecuted, however, they should fight it if they were following the law and should not take a plea bargain. It seems that the DA's office refuses to follow the law and makes every effort to subvert the law. I think patients should continue to follow the law, and if forced to go to court, fight it. Then there will be more cases like this where in the end they prevail."

After court today, Mr. Gasper said "I feel fantastic and relieved that the charge was dismissed, but still am concerned about the system. I am hoping that no one else has to go through this in the future. Patients should not have to lose everything to prove their innocence."



## SAN DIEGO COUNTY Supervisors Adopt De Facto Ban on Medical Marijuana

**SAN DIEGO** —On June 23rd, 2010, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors adopted a de facto ban on medical marijuana collective facilities. Although this ordinance does not directly affect regulations in the City of San Diego or the work of the San Diego City Council on the issue, today's vote does set a troubling precedent for other cities and counties to follow, and effectively eliminates all safe access to medical cannabis within the unincorporated areas of the county.

The language of the ordinance does not include an outright ban on dispensaries; however, the draconian zoning and licensing requirements proposed by the county completely eliminate the possibility for any facility to open.

This morning, the meeting began at 9 a.m. sharp with the Deputy Director of Planning and Land Use Jeff Murphy presenting the staff's report and explaining how complex, dangerous and expensive indoor cultivation was. Mr. Murphy explained that the proposed ordinance was designed to protect the community from the "dangers" associated with cultivating marijuana indoors.

Following Mr. Murphy's report, the Commissioner of Planning and Land Use presented the commission's recommendations with regards to this ordinance. The recommendations included a suggestion to reduce the 1,000 foot separation requirement from sensitive uses down to a less restrictive 600 feet, a decision made at the May 14th planning commission meeting where advocates and concerned citizens presented maps showing the commission that there were no areas where such a facility could locate at the 1000 foot separation requirement.

After the county staff's report and presentations, Commander Predergust from the San Diego County Sheriff's department went over the sheriff's licensing requirements in detail and reiterated the dangers he believes are associated with dispensaries. Cdr Predergust did not cite a single specific incident or any evidence to support his suggestions that these facilities were criminal enterprises and should be treated as such.

Following the reports and presentations, at least two dozen speakers from the community spoke out against the ordinance. Not all members of the public were in agreement on the medical efficacy of cannabis, but all were opposed to the ordinance as written. Many concerned citizens and members of the community that spoke today raised specific issues with the ordinance, as well as made specific recommendations to the Supervisors with regards to what should be changed in the ordinance.

Kate Valentine of San Diego Americans for Safe Access presented a short video that showed how all the proposed zones where the county's staff report says medical marijuana facilities could locate are either undeveloped land or cement factories.

Ms. Valentine reiterated to the board that this ordinance would zone out all facilities and suggested that the Supervisors add the following zones as allowed uses into the ordinance: Medical Center Commercial-C46, General Commercial-C36, Office Professional- C30, Heavy Commercial- C37, Convenience Commercial-C32, Freeway Commercial- C44, Service Commercial-C38 and Rural Commercial- C40.

After the public comments on the issue, Supervisor Dianne Jacobs raised a motion to include the original 1,000 foot separation requirement rather than follow their own commission's recommendations and make



the ordinance even more restrictive. Supervisor Horn quickly seconded the motion.


After Supervisor Jacob's comments, the rest of the Supervisors weighed in on the issue, and all with the exception of Ron Roberts supported the restrictive ordinance. The supervisors in support of the ordinance maintained that they did not have clarity as far as the conflict with Federal and State law, that they were still not sure if marijuana really was medicine and that they did not want it in their community.

The ordinance passed today with Supervisor Roberts being the only one to vote against it. The vote included Supervisor Jacobs' motion to increase the 600 foot separation requirement back to 1,000 feet and that the supervisors adopt the restrictive licensing requirements and other portions of the ordinance with the exception of the Zoning Regulations, which will be voted on June

Today, the Board of Supervisors did not even attempt to hide their bias and reefer madness propaganda. They openly were looking for ways to restrict and eliminate access to medical marijuana and were clearly trying to overturn the will of Californian voters. The Supervisors seemed ready to spend more of our tax payer dollars on litigating this issue.


It is the hope of many concerned citizens, patients and members of our community that the Supervisors reconsider their vote next week and modify the restrictive ordinance to actually provide safe access for patients in San Diego — rather than effectively eliminate it.

If Government fails to draw guidelines to follow, we tend to do it ourselves, and in industries that are border-lining the legal and illegal it is difficult to make a law that reads logically. Those who draw up a set of rules and regulations to follow and pay for will always be one step ahead of those who deny existence of things that are not meant to exist, but do.




t is hard to blame organizations taking the step to regulate things that are impossible for the governments to act on due to their stance in society or the religious ideas that constitute the actions of people in that particular society. However it is difficult to let people get blatantly ripped off by rogue traders without acting on it also. So in this article we will review how the seed companies rose from the ashes in the late 80s and 90s until they propagated into noxious weeds without anyone knowing how to select good from bad. It has always been a grey area and until it changes to either black or white, nothing will really change nor will there be mutual trust from both sides.

Seed companies began in Holland in the 80's and blossomed in that time and the early 90s based on good old fashioned selective breeding. This method was long arduous but with science on its side. Genetic diversity began to increase with stability and consistency. One could buy seeds from The Seed Bank and be assured of a genetic close to the description and with a genotype that was based from its origins. An Afghan crossed to a Thai was stabilized over a two year period with a lot of testing of different generations and then put out to the public market at a fair price for a fair amount of seeds. These F1 sold seeds went on to all the corners of the world and became the selected mothers of strains that grew in popularity in local areas. Names changed and other strains were introduced to those already being used as clone mothers and slowly the varietals (plant strains that are slightly different from each other)began to increase in numbers and diversity. Individual choices molded new sub strains. The process took time and things had legitimacy and authentic genetic origins with breeders knowing these origins to be sure.

The 90s saw a big explosion and larger growing movement in many countries that prior to seed company's existence only had hash cultures. This was in part due to a lack of sophistication in cannabis agriculture .Hash production took all plants big or small and represented a good average of all the crop in a resin form. So it was a good platform for growers of cannabis to use all plants no matter if they were good or bad. As the cannabis plant developed into specific individual plants like Skunk or Northern lights or Haze, the green revolution made those who did not like the hash culture stand up and show to the world that each plant that is selected for certain reasons was worthy of being grown locally and began to curb some of the demand for hashish ...as the cannabis increased in potency and taste and yields. The 90s was the golden age for cannabis of the modern day as it was the turning point in the education of cultivation. We implemented the technology and advancements in other ⊳





fields of the agricultural world .We learnt to keep cannabis alive consistently and how to clone and how


to breed properly.


Cannabis seed companies were mainly found in Holland in the 80s and 90s but with the green revolution and the growing phenomena of cannabis as distinct from hashish, countries with the perfect climates to cultivate grapes and olives began increasing their hand to cannabis. Pockets of fanatical breeders gained reputation with certain selected plants and these grew into legends since this field was still very much illegal in most places in the world. Canada, USA, Australia, and Spain began growing some excellent strains and Holland seemed to be the place where most of those sub-cultured breeders and unknown growers congregated. Coffee shops in the early 90s in Holland were more like open forums of discussion on how to achieve different things with cannabis breeding and growing. Knowledge multiplied and became accessible to a wider audience than ever before and the golden age of cloning and breeding flourished with good reason and good products.

The early 90s in Holland was probably like Paris in the time of the \*Existentialist movement (1950s) or The Beat Generation...underground figures emerging into public cafes to debate compare and advance.

Companies were still few and most of them had their niche markets and followers. I was living in Amsterdam with the likes of Rob Clarke, Eddy from the flying Dutchmen, Ben Dronkers, NevilleSchoenmakers (The Seed Bank and Sensi Seed), David Watson, Soma and Luke from Paradise, Simon from Serious Seed, and many others. You could go to a coffee shop like Russland or Siberia or The Kajtsuand meet like-minded people all who had moved to this haven to breed their wares and make their products available to the world. Breeding was in its pinnacle of development and we all had time and the support and technology we needed to make this into a worthy and esteemed vocation. In fact with the aid of the High Times Cannabis Cup, which took on a real voice for the unrepresented breeder until this point; the whole industry reached a hype and status unfamiliar to it previously.

I recall winning several Cannabis cups in the early 90s and with the introduction of the seed form of the widow family hybrids in the mid 90s; well it became a world watched event. Even people not from this world would call me up to congratulate or ask questions on strains .It seemed like we, the seed breeders were moving into a time of freedom never seen on the planet before. Debate, experimentation, technology all seemed to compliment the cannabis breeders like never before in





the world...and the heart was Holland. Even plants deemed special and discovered in Australia or USA were brought to breeders in Holland to wave their magic over and stabilize them enough to launch new varietals in seed form, to be sold worldwide. The Golden years shinned over all who passed through or stayed long enough to sample...and the movement had certain integrity. Unstable poorly bred seed without real work fell by the wayside as they should and breeds that flourished and were worked on for several years and deemed worthy stable good products went on to reach legend status. Plants like Super Silver Haze, Widow, Critical Mass, Northern lights became the new super models of the cannabis world, winning multiple awards and putting the smiles on growers' faces worldwide. It seemed that Cannabis had shed its hippy and anti-establishment image and was now respectable. In fact Cannabis was becoming hip and useful to many people it had never reached out to before. People with cancer and severe depression or MS were beginning to use cannabis as a last alternative to generic medicines to avoid side effects worst than the real condition and seemed satisfied with managing their pain and suffering, without disturbing any part of society. In a compassionate way, it seemed Cannabis was beginning to give a quality of life to the terminally ill never known before from any medication, especially one that was accessible to grow from a seed

in your own garden in your part of the world.

With the advent of indoor grow rooms and the increased sophistication of growing techniques cannabis was fast becoming an underground self contained all round plant able to curb the pain of the sick and put a smile on the faces of the recreational user. There was something for everyone, and so much diversity it was like being at the entrance gates of Willy Wonkers chocolate factory ...

With the highs inevitably the lows rear their ugly faces too! The Seed business was like Brail for the blind; you could feel it but it was not visible to the eye.

Fast food phenomena began to replace the quality home cooked specialties of specific cultures making the taste for the entire world the same or similar. It was like we went to sleep one night after a hearty meal from mum and woke to MacDonald's or Kentucky Fried Chicken. The advent of feminized seed use and production came with a lot of promises of greatness but really achieved a backward step or a Holt more to the point in cannabis breeding. For the seed companies to survive and give to the people what they were vainly promised meant breeding took a back seat. Feminized seed has its use but its appeal and promises represented a bigger threat ⊳



to the armchair farmers. Cannabis was leaving the subculture world it had grown up in and flourished in for reasons of integrity and quality only to be consumed by fame and fortune. It has now reached a moment of rock star status and it seems that the stardom has blinded the masses.

Without blaming anyone or any one company, we must take responsibility as a group at the state of affairs that cannabis breeding is in at this moment. It is not the fault of any one event or phenomena, it is at a point where fertilizing a selected clone mother with chemical induction seems to constitute breeding...but it is nothing to do with breeding. In fact there is now a shift for established seed companies to buy in certain feminized seeds from 6 or 8 different seed producers and rename them according to their company's names but the seed sold is the same. So the only difference is that seed became easier to make and cheaper to make and process of renaming it and repackaging it made it somehow different from each other. It has little or nothing to do with breeding a strain which takes a minimum of 2 years from beginning to end, whereas feminizing a seed from a female selected plant with chemicals takes 6-10 weeks to produce seed. A company only needs to keep female plants and not males so the entire cost of research and mother rooms and numbers of plants are all less and therefore cheaper to maintain.

So why does seed, especially feminized seed become so

expensive if everything to do with it makes it more efficient and cheaper? Where do genetics origins arrive from for these seeds and can we be sure their descriptions are precise? In simple we cannot be sure nor do we really know where these origins arise from since most new seed companies like ones in Spain or Canada for example are all derived from regular old school genetics. That led to popularizing a female selected clone and then chemically inducing it to make female seed. In fact most new seed companies do not even hold a male in their camps! So with the increase in demand for promises of only female plants to those growers too lazy to select a plant from a natural set of seed, comes a decline in cannabis breeding which is what the seed industry arose from. It is almost like we are cutting off our nose despite our face, knowingly for convenience and sacrificing special or rare genes for mediocrity. Soon all seed will be the same if seed companies keep going down the road of least resistance, ease and convenience. You will not need to look at anything other than the price to make a decision for what to grow as that will be the only difference between seed companies.

It disturbs me greatly the seed business of today, even though I have been in it the past quarter of a century. When a person like me is disturbed by the industry he loves and has a passion for, how is the best way to explain that to the new comers without putting them off? It is a time now for the end user, medical patient and medical grower to get educated about the companies they choose to support. My advice to any potential seed buyers for the future is to first do a lot of reading to find out what plant seems to cater for your needs. Then go on some forums and ask other growers who have experience with a particular seed or plant, not rely on the descriptions and hype from any one company.

The wealth of grow reports and discussion and photos about strains are sufficiently represented in the public and private forums and you only need time to read and digest the information. The internet makes the end user the boss if they manage to do a good grow report, as those who review the thread usually believe a person who bought the seed and grew the seed, as would I! Finding seed close to the origins of the pedigree is important, and instead of just looking at a name of a strain find when the strain originated from, which company, if they keep both parent plants, and so on. But most of all, the thing that will make seed companies become less dishonest will be a support desk. If a seed company is prepared to sell a product in blind trust to a client who is paying for it based on the integrity of the company, then the same company should also be able to support any problems or questions or supply a back up service to their resellers. Without support or having a place to be able to ask questions, the seed will be like playing the lottery.







# Cannabinoids and exual Reproductive Health

ver the years, we have delved deeply into the effects produced by cannabinoids on the reproductive systems of humans and other animals. These effects constitute one of the earliest scientifically discovered areas of potential physiological risk associated with cannabis use. Furthermore, the real world risk posed to cannabis users by these effects have been hotly debated for at least four decades. The effects of cannabis use on most aspects of both female and male reproductive functions are generally of an inhibitory or suppressive nature, which has often been labeled negative or bad in the past. It is only recently that we have really began to understand the role the endocannabinoid system plays in regulating reproduction and how this leads to the effects on reproductive processes which follow cannabinoid use. Although they are often lumped together I will not be covering ontogeny, i.e. fetal development, in this article. Instead, I will mostly focus on the parents and a few relatively superficial measurements of health at birth of offspring. >



#### **The Early Years**


The early years of cannabis research occurred during a period of time when drugs with teratogenic qualities, or those which produce birth defects, were all the scare. Therefore the powers that be made a concerted effort to demonstrate that cannabis and THC produced clear teratogenic effects. To their dismay they found that THC produced no readily apparent teratogenesis (1,2,3,4) and that cannabis extract or smoke condensate preparations had minimal/subtle apparent teratogenic impact at best (worst?) (1). The most reliable readily observable results of giving cannabinoids to pregnant lab animals is that the mother has reduced weight gain and to a lesser extent the pups as well although this is not always observed (3,5,6). An increased rate of reabsorption of the fetus following the administration of cannabinoids during gestation is observed as well (1,5). There is also some evidence that relatively low postnatal weight in prenatally exposed lab animals persists longer in females than males (6).

Less consistently similar findings were observed in the human population. In a population of 420 predominately middle class expecting mothers, of which about three percent used cannabis while pregnant, both reduced maternal weight gain and reduced length of gestation were associated with cannabis use. However, neither the birthing process nor neonate weight appeared to be effected in this population (7). Others have also found no apparent effect of cannabis use on human fetal development (8). Similarly, in a study of 12,424 mothers, although cannabis use was associated with malformations, reduced birthweight, and shorter gestation, these differences did not remain statistically significant when maternal habits, demographics, and medical history were factored in. This suggested that, like reduced birthweight and shorter gestation, use of cannabis was more symptomatic of these other factors than a causal factor itself (9).

As I discussed in my preceding article, Cannabis-Influenced Sexuality (TY #23), cannabis use produces a pretty reliable effect on both male and female endocrine systems. Early research found that acute doses of THC in female rats the day before they went into heat/estrus inhibited pituitary endocrine release and thus downstream hormonal increases in the ovaries resulting in delayed ovulation by 24hrs. This effect of THC appeared to be the result of a direct inhibition of hypothalamic production of gonadotropin releasing hormone (10). Similar results were found with mice such that exposure to cannabis extract for eight days delayed the onset of proestrus (the point in the female cycle immediately preceding heat) and at the highest dose tested inhibited female receptivity during heat while suppressing progesterone during the postestrus period. The only apparent effect of a 70 day treatment with either cannabis extract or THC was to dose-dependently reduce the number of pregnancies which made it to term (11). Another study found that administration of either cannabis extract or smoke condensate shortened the time female rats spent in estrus while in general increasing the non-estrus portion of their cycle but specifically the postestrus period (12). Female mice subcutaneously administered THC during pregnancy also were found to have reduced mammary gland growth compared to controls as well as impaired production of prolactin (13). Others found preliminary evidence of similar effects on human estrus cycle following chronic use by women in their twenties (14). Even though frequent human cannabis use did not appear to significantly alter a wide range of pregnancyrelated hormones when compared to those found in nonusers (15), cannabis use was found to produce a dose-dependent statistically significant reduction in the length of human gestation (16). This reduction on average was not substantial.

In males, the inhibition of gonadotropin releasing hormone production in the hypothalamus by THC mentioned above was found to result in downstream reductions in luteinizing hormone by the pituitary gland and in testosterone production by the testes. This in turn was found to result in decreased sperm production (17,18,19). Early studies also often attributed the reduced motility of sperm observed both in animals given cannabinoids and in human users of cannabis who used it regularly to these endocrine changes (14,17,18,19), however, it was later determined that the effect on motility was more direct.

Others during this time suggested cannabis may be responsible for a small population of birth defects but this was never clearly substantiated. Indeed, even during this early period, the real world human impact of these findings was brought into question because of the lack of consistent and clear direct cannabis-related impact on either conception or successful childbirth in the cannabis-using population. As Abel, 1981, stated in his review on the topic:



Cannabinoids

"Despite some consistencies in the data in virtually every study conducted with animals, there has been a basic confounding between direct drug action and secondary effects resulting from drug-induced decreases in food and water consumption and attendant weight loss. Almost all of the adverse effects of cannabinoid exposure on reproductive organs can be attributed to these secondary effects (17)."




#### **Female Reproductive Health and** the Endocannabinoid System

Since these early years of scientific exploration into the effects of cannabis, our understanding of the endocannabinoid system and its constituent parts has grown substantially. During this time period, we discovered the two primary cannabinoid receptors, several of their endogenous ligands such as anandamide and 2-AG, as well as the enzymes responsible for the synthesis, deactivation and transport of these ligands back into the

cells they were released from. We also have identified endocannabinoids which primarily function to modulate the function of these enzymes. The discovery of the endocannabinoid system has allowed us to begin to understand the role this system plays in regulating reproduction and thus why cannabis may be producing the effects we see on the reproductive systems of lab animals and to a lesser extent humans. Indeed, the endocannabinoids are not only found in most of the critical reproductive tissues and the fluids they produce (20) but also in the pre-implantation embryo and blastocyst (21,22). The cannabinoid receptors are found in these tissues as well (20).

In the pre-implantation mouse embryo, the CB2 receptor is present from the single cell stage onwards whereas the CB1 receptor appears near the end of the twocell stage of embryo development. Administration of the cannabinoids anandamide, THC, WIN-55,212-2, and CP-55,940, but not CBD, to two-cell embryos in culture were all capable of dose-dependently terminating development of the embryos during the four to eight-cell stage of development. Anandamide also altered the normal in-culture course of embryonic development between the eight-cell and blastocyst stages of development. Furthermore, the mouse uterus and oviduct were found to express the requisite enzymes of the synthesis of anandamide (21).


Other experiments have demonstrated that a critical balance of endocannabinoid system tone is required for proper development and implantation of the embryo.



The enzyme responsible for the metabolic breakdown and deactivation of anandamide is known as FAAH. Increased levels of anandamide are found in the tissues of mice bred to not express the gene responsible for FAAH. Therefore, an imbalance is produced in the endocannabinoid system tone of these FAAH-knockout mice. Embryo development is altered and onschedule implantation is delayed in these mice, both of which may lead to poor pregnancy outcome. These results are mirrored by either the administration of a FAAH inhibitor or a CB1 receptor agonist like THC. If a FAAH-knockout mother is bred to a wild-type father, the developmental alterations do not occur although implantation is still impaired, implying that the two effects are controlled by local FAAH action in the embryo and the mother separately (23). There are some basic similarities between the changes produced by excess prenatal anandamide exposure and those seen following exposure to prenatal stress (24). This suggests that prenatal stress may tip the balance of endocannabinoid system tone in the direction of more anandamide and thereby exert some of the changes seen following prenatal stress. In extreme cases this may even lead to termination of early pregnancy processes via endocannabinoid system mediated mechanisms. The role of the endocannabinoid system in gestation itself, but not ontogeny, appears to be reasonably limited after implantation of the egg into the uterine wall.

At least one recent study into the effects of using cannabis on reproductive cycle length in women has confirmed the early results found in animal studies. Cannabis use prolongs the phase of the cycle between menstruation and ovulation. Interestingly, this effect was found to have a biphasic dose-response curve such that occasional use of three times or less per three month period produced the greatest deferment of ovulation by about 3.5 days on average while more frequent use produced only a 2 day average deferment of ovulation (25). This effect may be in part explained by the expression and function of the endocannabinoid system in human ovaries. Here, most components of the endocannabinoid system are only present in the soon to mature, mature, and post-ovulation ovarian follicles. The follicular fluid concentration of anandamide also appears to correlate positively to follicular size/degree of maturity such that the larger and more mature the follicle is, the more anandamide is found in the fluid of this follicle. This correlation has been found to slight but statistically significant. The anandamide concentration found in follicles containing mature eggs is found to be 58% greater than the concentration observed in follicles contain immature eggs (26).

Interestingly, even though excess anandamide produced by deactivation of FAAH either genetically or pharmacologically produces negative consequences for pregnancy through a CB1 dependant mechanism, the lack of CB1 receptors during pregnancy can also affect outcome. CB1-knockout mice give birth prematurely. This appears to be the result of an estrogen/progesterone imbalance which is driven by an increase in corticotrophin-releasing hormone and corticosterone produced by the CNS late in pregnancy. If the action of corticotrophin-releasing hormone is pharmacologically blocked, the CB1-knockout mice go to full term (27). It appears that deficiencies in the CB1 receptor can also affect proper transport of the embryo through the oviduct/fallopian tube and that this may be a factor in ectopic pregnancy. In CB1-knockout mice about 40% of pregnancies are lost due to retention of the embryo in the oviduct. In the absence of the CB1 receptor, the smooth muscle of the oviduct appears to be in a relatively constant state of contraction which impairs the transport of embryos through the oviduct. This is probably due to a loss of feedback produced by the endocannabinoid system on the adrenergic neurons responsible for smooth muscle control (28). Similar findings have also been observed in the preliminary research on human ectopic pregnancies. In healthy women, CB1 receptor densities in their fallopian tubes vary with their menstrual cycle such that there are more of these receptors following ovulation to menstruation than following menstruation to ovulation. These receptors are located on the inner surface of the fallopian tubes and associated with smooth muscles cells therein. Women with ectopic pregnancies were found to have lower CB1 receptor densities in both their fallopian tubes and in their uterine lining compared to women with normal intrauterine pregnancies. Although this finding was not statistically significant, two difference polymorphisms for CBNR1, the gene encoding for the CB1 receptor, were found to be more frequent in women with ectopic pregnancies than in women with normal pregnancies, suggesting that genetic variation in the cannabinoid receptor may predispose women to developing ectopic pregnancies. The authors suggested the variations in CB1 receptor densities in the fallopian tubes may be governed by progesterone since their densities in the >



fallopian tubes peak when progesterone is peaking in the menstrual cycle (29,30). So clearly the endocannabinoid system plays a central role regulating gestational processes as well, both near the beginning and the end of pregnancy. This is particularly important considering that there are many women who use cannabis during pregnancy as a treatment for "morning sickness" and that the vast majority of those who do so report that it is effective to very effective (31).

#### Male Reproductive Health and the **Endocannabinoid System**

Our understanding of the role of the endocannabinoid system in male reproductive health and thus how cannabis produces the effects on sperm that it does has grown substantially since the early days of the simple declaration that cannabis will produce male sterility. Early observations that cannabinoids could inhibit the production of sperm and inhibit their normal motility did not offer us much explanation for why or how cannabinoids produced these effects other than they centrally altered the endocrine balance in males, possibly resulting in these downstream reproductive changes. It was not clearly understood what if any direct effect cannabinoids had on male reproductive functions and especially on sperm. In recent years we have begun to more fully understand the integral role the endocannabinoid plays in some male reproductive functions and thus why cannabis and more specifically THC effect sperm the way they do.

In 2005, human sperm was found to express CB1, but not CB2, receptors on both the head and the mitochondrial sheath covering the base of the tale, a.k.a. the midpiece (32). When the CB1 receptors in the midpiece of the sperm are activated by anandamide or THC, the activity of the mitochondria which produce the swimming motion of the sperm is dampened. It is this dampening of the mitochondrial activity which produces the inhibition of sperm motility following use of cannabis. When the receptors in the head of the sperm are activated by anandamide or THC, the acrosome reaction is impaired. The acrosome is the outer shell of the head of the sperm containing the enzymes responsible for fusing to and penetrating the egg and thus fertilization. When the acrosome reaction is impaired, so is the ability of the sperm to fertilize the egg (33, 34). When sperm are incubated in culture for three hours in biologically relevant concentrations of THC, there are dose-dependent reductions in motility and both spontaneous and induced acrosome reaction. Sperm swimming velocity is also reduced by about 10%. These effects of THC on sperm appeared to be stronger in sperm of the 45th percentile (poor quality) than in the 90th percentile (those with the best fertilization potential). In other words, the less healthy the sperm, the



more cannabinoids impair it. Interestingly, chemicallyinduced acrosome reaction was inhibited two to three times as much as spontaneous acrosome reaction (35). A stable analog of anandamide dose-dependently decreased the survival rate of sperm in culture at least in part by inhibiting sperm production of two different prosurvival proteins, whereas sperm survival was improved by exposure to the CB1 antagonist, rimonabant (34).

This brings us to an interesting question: Why is the endocannabinoid system present in sperm and what biologically relevant role does in play in sperm health and/or function? We now know part of the answer thanks in part to our little friends the CB1-knockout mice. It has long been known that sperm entering the epididymus from the testes do not appear to possess the ability to swim and that by the time they leave the epididymus during ejaculation they have started to gain this ability. In 2007, it was shown that the epididymus produces endocannabinoids and that these act to inhibit sperm motility while sperm are stored in the epididymus. Furthermore, in wild-type mice, sperm entering the epididymus essentially lacked motility but had gained it by the time they left the epididymus. However, in CB1-knockout mice, sperm had already gained substantial motility upon entering the epididymus (36). Earlier this year, a 2-AG concentration gradient produced by sperm during their course through the epididymus was discovered. This gradient was such that 2-AG, one of the primary endocannabinoids, was produced in significantly higher concentrations by sperm entering the epididymus than by those leaving it. It is > Out of the Shadows, Into the Light...

When CB1 receptors are deactivated either genetically (CB1-knockout mice) or pharmacologically (CB1 antagonists like rimonabant), sperm entering the epididymus are substantially more active. The opposite is true when the 2-AG gradient is abolished by the blockade of endocannabinoid reuptake transport, thereby creating a more stable 2-AG concentration throughout the epididymus, and thus sperm with impaired motility upon leaving the epididymus (37). This mirrors the effect on sperm motility seen following administration of exogenous cannabinoids like THC and cannabis.

The sperm produced by FAAH-knockout mice, genetically lacking the ability to produce FAAH and thus the ability to deactivate anandamide, take a high anandamide environment with them which produces some interesting effects. One of the first effects observed was that the average litter size resulting from a wild-type mother mating with a FAAH-knockout father was approximately 13% smaller than the average litter sized produced by two wild-type parents. It was then observed that FAAH-knockout males fertilized only about two thirds the number of wild-type eggs as wildtype males fertilized. In culture, FAAH-knockout sperm were only capable of producing about half the fertilization rate of wild-type sperm on wild-type eggs. Wild-type sperm respond to the female environment by becoming hyperactive and changing their swimming pattern from traveling in strain lines to traveling in large arcs. The FAAH-knockout sperm appear to swim slower than wild-type sperm in general, to travel in arcs and not strait lines before exposure to female environment, and failed to be hyperactivated by said exposure. In culture, FAAH-knockout sperm were able to bind to the protective barrier around the egg and produced acrosome reactions about as readily as wild-type sperm, yet still showed a significantly impaired ability to actually penetrate the barrier and thus fertilize the egg. When incubated with eggs lacking this protective barrier, FAAH-knockout sperm produced an egg fertilization rate within the normal range. Because the hyperactivity of sperm induced by the female environment, which is lacking in FAAH-knockout sperm, plays a critical role in the ability of sperm to penetrate the egg's protective barrier, it was proposed that the sluggish nature of the FAAH-knockout sperm was impairing their ability to fertilize normal eggs (38).

The CB1 receptor is not the only receptor responsive to cannabinoids present in sperm or which plays a part in male reproduction. Both the CB2 and the TPVR1 vanilloid receptor are present and play a role. Whereas the CB1 receptor was found in both the head and the midpiece of human sperm, TPVR1 receptors were found only in the head (39). The mitochondria in the midpiece of the sperm are responsible for the swimming motion of mature sperm and it is the location of CB1 receptors on these mitochondria that allows cannabinoids to inhibit sperm motility. It is therefore not surprising that since TPVR1 receptors are restricted to the head of the sperm they do not appear to effect motility. These vanilloid receptors are, however, able to effect acrosome reaction and thus sperm/egg fusion. If activation of these receptors is blocked by a TPRV1 antagonist, their spontaneous rate of acrosome reaction increases while the rate of progesterone-induced acrosome reactions decreases. This in turn inhibits the sperm/egg fusion enhancing effect of progesterone. Anandamide binds to and activates the TPRV1 receptor. If the sperm are pretreated with an endocannabinoid reuptake transporter inhibitor which elevates the extracellular concentrations of anandamide around the sperm, TPRV1 antagonism fails to increase spontaneous acrosome reaction rates or impair the enhancing effect of progesterone on sperm/egg fusion (39).

Through the action of 2-AG, the CB2 receptors have been found to play a role in spermatogenesis. In the process of spermatogenesis, or creation of sperm, the sperm precursor cells known as spermatogonia undergo several transformations ending with two meiotic cell divisions, which result in four sperm cells from every spermatogonium parent cell (40). Meiosis is the process of producing sperm cells which only contain half the genetic code of the parent and is necessary for creating offspring which are a genetic mix of their parents. Spermatogonia which are about to divide express high levels of the 2-AG synthesizing enzyme and relatively low levels of the 2-AG deactivating enzyme, and, as a result, produce significant levels of 2-AG compared to meiotic or post meiotic cells. The 2-AG produced by these cells activates CB2 receptors which are expressed by spermatogonia during this phase of spermatogenesis and in so doing initiates pro-meiotic processes. Selective exogenous CB2 agonists are able to mimic this meiosis-facilitating action of 2-AG, confirming that 2-AG is exerting its spermatogenesis promoting properties through the CB2 receptor (41). CB2 receptors also appear to influence sperm motility. Whereas CB1 activation appears to increase the percentage of sperm which are completely inactive, CB2 activation increases the percentage of specifically slow/sluggish sperm (42).


#### **Questions Still Remain**

As indicated above, because of a lack of consistent and clear real world human evidence that cannabis significantly impacted either successful conception or childbirth, and because most of the observed effects could be seen as secondary and not direct of effects of cannabinoids, their relevance to human cannabis users has long been questioned (17). At the time this was supported by animal study findings that indicated that proper nutrition could counteract the most the adverse effects of cannabis administration on gestation, and furthermore, that cannabis and poor nutrition produced a synergistically poor gestational outcome (43). This was a finding echoed a few years later when Adel, 1985, reported that alcohol or cannabis

alone had no appreciable effect on the fetal mortality rate in either rats or mice compared to untreated controls while the combination of alcohol and cannabis together produced fetal mortality rates of 75% and 100% in rats and mice respectively (44).

The question of whether it is context or cannabis itself that is causing the negative impact on gestation is still being asked today. In 2006, Schempf and Strobino reported that in a population of 808 low income women delivering babies at Johns Hopkins Hospital, there was no effect of cannabis on poor birth outcomes which did not disappear when other risk factors such as drinking, smoking, social stress, lack of social/familial support, older age, depression, unemployment or poor education were controlled for (45). This led the authors to suggest that socioeconomic context played a much greater role in the previously observed negative birth outcomes associated with cannabis use than the cannabis use itself.

Finally, it had been previously reported in 1995 that



childhood acute myelogenous leukemia (AML) was associated with maternal cannabis use (46). However, even this adverse finding has been recently brought into question by a report published by a pediatric clinical cooperative group known as the Children's Cancer Group. In a large study of 517 AML cases and 610 matched controls, they found no connection between the mother having ever used cannabis and the risk of developing AML, whereas an apparent reduced risk of developing AML was observed in the population who reported using cannabis anytime during the 3 months preceding conception through pregnancy to delivery (47).

#### **Conclusion**

In some ways we have come a long way to go in our understanding of why and how cannabis affects the two different sexes' reproductive systems the way it does. Interestingly, despite a great deal of research going into the topic, our understanding of what cannabis does to these systems has not changed much over the last four decades. What has changed is our discovery and growing understanding of the endocannabi-

noid system and the roles it naturally plays in regulating the reproductive systems. Indeed, because the endocannabinoid system appears to be involved in an endocannabinoid/hormone/cytokine axis which exerts the majority of the observed biological control of human fertility, it has been proposed that the endocannabinoids represent a novel set of lipokines (lipid-based hormones) providing critical regulation of reproductive processes (48). This revelation may be one of the most important advances in the topic of cannabinoid/reproduction interactions in nearly three decades. This shift in perspective will likely allow for a more holistic understanding of what role the endocannabinoid system plays in regulating reproduction. One of the potential future outcomes of this would be the development of cannabinoid or endocannabinoid tone modulating forms of contraceptive and/or pro-fertility therapy. In this sense, not everyone considers the impact of cannabis use on reproduction to be negative as such. Some actually consider the sperm and ovulation inhibiting properties of cannabis to be a desirable byproduct of use. However, for those who do not share this perspective, understanding how cannabis use may influence their reproductive health may be critical to their success at starting a family.







#### **Clinical Review:**

In Mendocino and Humboldt Counties of California. 7,514 patients have been seen in review of their use of cannabis. Based on patient report the initial non-psychoactive use of cannabis was as dry leaf capsules t.i.d. for migraines. After ICRS 2008 this was switched to juiced fresh leaf to improve access to the cannabinoid acids and terpenes. In October 2009 fresh mature bud was added to the leaf and juiced. A 43 year WM with 30-year history of working in construction was evaluated as being bone on bone at both hips and knees and was told he would need joint replacements. He presented with classic use of heat to decarboxylate THCA into THC. Heat increases THC from 90 µg/ml to 10,060 µg/ml. This sweeping conversion from negligible THC into clinically effective THC is done at the expense of reducing the 14,500 µg/ml of THCA found in the unheated plant into the 150 µg/ml of residual THCA in the heated plant and reducing the total tolerable antioxidant dose to 1/50th the origin dose.

The biggest drawback to steeping, sautéing, baking, smoking or vaporizing cannabis is that the THC generated creates a marked reduction in the THCA/CBDA dosage. The THC tolerant individual adjusts their smoking behavior to limit their ingestion to 10 mg. The amounts of THCA present in cannabis range from 16-17% w/w or 72 gm THCA/lb or 4.54 gm THCA/ounce or 162 mg/gm of cannabis. Complementing the THCA, CBDA is present at 1.0% CBD w/w or 4,500 mg/lb in Northern Lights, a common strain.

New strains at 5% CBD w/w provide 22,700 mg/lb. Current "Effective oral human dosage ranges for cannabidiol are contemplated to vary from about 1-40 mg/kg. for example 5-20 mg/kg, and in particular a dose of about 20mg/kg of body weight." US 6,630,507 Column 20, Line 29. However even at 5 mg/kg, CBD blocks the development of diabetes in 58% of NOD mice, a genetically driven model that normally develop diabetes in 86% of the mice. A dose of 5 mg/kg works out to be 250 mg for a 50 kg individual and a 500 mg for a 100kg individual.

#### **Discussion:**

Autocrine and paracrine modulation of cellular physiology, resource management and remediation of subclinical and clinical pathophysiology has been the domain of Eicosanoid chemistry for billions of years. The arachidonic cascade includes the prostaglandins. leukotrienes, thromboxanes and the encannins (endogenous cannabinoids). Broad host virus transduct plasmid host DNA between plants, animals and bacteria accounting for the lateral co-evolution of Endo/Exogenous Cannabinoids. Billions of years of single cell resource management, symbiotic, and endosymbiotic evolution culminated in multi-cellular life forms all of which were catalysed by the locally acting lipid messenger molecules. While the immunologic recognition of self / non-self is at the core of detecting foreign pathogens and pre-cancerous growth, regulatory access to this system is granted through the broad host virus domain to allow botanical partners to bind to orthosteric and allosteric sites on receptor molecules that modulate immunologic efficacy. As the life span increased from 3 to 9 decades through improvements in infant survival, agriculture and control of infectious pathogens the inflammatory system became over active secondary to accumulative traumatic and degenerative changes eventually the inflammatory system takes on characteristics of an autoimmune disorder. Cannabis is the sole source of a patented lipophillic anti-oxidants and neuroprotectants, a broad terpenoid profile with complementary immunologic activity as well as altering CB2 binding affinity through allosteric modulation. In addition cannabis is the unique source of the essential cannabinoid acids that aid in down regulation of the inflammatory arm of the immune system, mitigating oxidative associated diseases ranging from diabetes, cancer, CNS and myocardial degenerative and ischemic conditions and autoimmune disorders. The FDA approval of CBD as an IND at 600 mg/day mirrors DHHS effective oral human dosage schedule, inclusion of THC reduces tolerable dosage to < 10 mg.

#### **Dietary Labeling:**

Nutritional labeling uses Daily Values also called Reference Daily Intake values based on Recommended Dietary Allowances / RDA's last updated in 1968. RDA's meet the needs of 97-98% of the population. EAR or Estimated Average Requirements are set to be sufficient to meet the needs of 50% of the population. Adequate Intake or AI is an estimate of an unknown RDA. To further complicate nutritional nomenclature in 1997 IOM developed the Dietary Reference Intake / DRI which is not yet in common usage. When Upper Limits (UL) have not been established or determined it is recommended that use be limited to whole food to prevent potential adverse effects from excessive intake. Based on current research Adequate Intake of the Conditionally Essential Cannabinoid Acids ranges from 250 to 500 mg/day, supported by FDA approval of CBD as an IND at 600 mg/day in divided doses. In acute ischemia cannabinoid dosages range from 1-2,000 mg/day. The psychoactive effects of 10 mg of THC restricts the dose of THCA / CDBA to negligible levels, markedly below the proposed AI.

# Cannabis Pain Patch

I came up with this idea while making an alcohol-based tincture. Almost every time I make it, I forget to put on gloves and about half way in I am usually pretty stoned just from absorbing it through my skin.

### Here's what your going to need:

- 1. Alcohol-based tincture
- 2. Paper towels



Wrap in plastic. I have lots of plastic mailers around, so i just cut it long ways. It has an adhesive on one end which I use to close it and keep it in place. Secure the outer shell and you're done!

I usually wear it for about 30 minutes. It gives a good 4-6 hours of warm, relaxed, looseness. I bet if I used a higher quality tincture it would last longer. One thing that I have noticed is if I smoke a cigarette while I'm wearing it I get a cool little head change.

\*The only negative with this is it will stain your skin green. use some soap and water and it will come right off\*

**Drape the damp towel over** the area you need pain relief. In my case it's my knee, but this has also been tested on the lower back with decent results.

I believe this is going to be the next break through in spot specific pain treatment with cannabis tinctures.

# Harborside Health Centre

his issue we get to take a special look at one of the best medical marijuana dispensaries in California. Located in Oakland, it is a truly special place where medicine is top quality and the people greet you with a smile. Yes, it's Harborside Health Center. Already a very well-respected name in the community, they have only been around a few years but have gained momentum so quickly they have come to be one of the model examples of what this movement should really be all about. It's simply compassion. Steve DeAngelo was gracious enough to take time out of his busy schedule to talk with us and to give me some real insight into what Harborside is all about.

Thanks for sitting down to talk with us today, we really appreciate it when someone as busy as you are takes the time to give the patients an extra look at what you do.

Steve - No problem, I have been meaning to take a look at one of your magazine so I was really happy you were stopping by and that you brought some with you. Thanks.

# Can you tell me more about Harborside, like why you decided to open and have you been the owner from the get-go?

Steve - I am one of two co-founders of Harborside Health Center, yes. I opened Harborside to create a new model of excellence in both activism and professionalism in the medical cannabis industry. When I got here from my home town of Washington D.C. about 10 years ago, I found that almost all the dispensaries — well, all the dispensaries — either fell into one of two categories. Either they were well-meaning activist dispensaries run by people with very little business experience or capital, or they were thug dispensaries run by people who basically who wanted to get legal protection for their already existing underground businesses, but didn't really want to change the way they

were doing business very much. They just wanted to continue to make huge profits and not really put very much into the community or their facilities. In both cases, the dispensaries that these groups put together were often in inappropriate locations. They were often not very clean. They were often not very well furnished or equipped. The staff was often either indifferent or poorly trained, they were not very well organized and the selection and the quality was not very good. I felt that neither the patients nor the community were being served very well. It got even worse when we started seeing newspaper stories and exposés about dispensary operators who owned 200 pairs of sunglasses and \$3 million houses and Porsches and Mercedes Benzes. It became clear to me that there was a need for a new model of dispensary to demonstrate that cannabis could be distributed in a way that was safe, seemly and responsible. So I started Harborside in order to provide that new model of excellence for the industry.

### Can you tell us how you've had to change since you began?

Steve - Well, we're a non-profit community service organization. So, as our patient base and our revenues have increased, we've been able to introduce more and more



new programs. So, for example, when we first opened, our holistic care clinic was only open two days a week and offered five therapies. We are now open seven days a week and offer eleven different therapies. We've also introduced entirely new programs. We introduced a care package program — well, the care package program, we've had since the beginning, but it has grown. Our program, before the recession hit this year, was serving about 200 people, but it's now serving 600 people per week and we give each person a free gram and a half of medicine. We've been steadily introducing new patient services. One of them was the Patient Activist Resource Center, where we have a dedicated phone, fax and computer. Patients come in and they are provided with contact information for their elected representatives, and they are presented with talking points. They sit down and use the facility for an hour, lobbying and standing up for their rights, and at the end of that hour we give them a free gram of medicine. And it is a great program. We also introduced a new program recently, our cannabis-friendly substance use and misuse program. This is a program that we set up in response to complaints from patients of ours who had developed dependencies on various different types of substances and were trying to find some help. Often they had gone to other twelve step groups or other NA groups and, when they said that they were also using medical cannabis, were expelled from those groups or shunned. So we surveyed our patients and found that about 15% of patients did have some type of substance that they felt was problematic and wanted some help. For the most part, in this order of preference it was: tobacco, alcohol, pharmaceuticals, other illegal street drugs, and we even had a couple patients who wanted help with their cannabis use. So we now have a trained treatment specialist who does intake interviews with each patient who >

wants to participate in the program and then we have three different support groups that we can put them into.

We have a whole network of cannabis friendly treatment specialists that we can refer people to, and we even do one-on-one counseling. So I think it's just love turning the paradigm on its head. Here they accuse us of being drug dealers, right? But now we're using our cannabis sales to be able to help people end their dependencies on dangerous but legal substances like tobacco, alcohol and other pharmaceuticals. One thing we're working on now is the insurance and licensing issues. So we will be able to provide a primary care clinic twice a month here and also in our San Jose location. We are going to have a licensed MD who will come and provide primary medical care to people who need it, for people who do not have normal insurance and who do not have primary care in their lives. Lowincome patients will be able to come here, and we will be able to supply them that primary medical care that the US health care system has been unable to provide to so many people in need. So that's another new program, but probably the most exciting change at Harborside since we opened was in December of 2009. We introduced our analytical laboratory testing program. We became the first facility anywhere in 3000 years of cannabis history that I know of, to actually send all of our medicine to an analytical laboratory for safety screening and potency evaluation before it is provided to our patients. That has been a tremendously successful program in the last year. We started learning really new, and fascinating things about the cannabis supply in California. Most notably that there is almost zero CBD present in the medical cannabis supply in most dispensaries, or at least this dispensary. So in response to that we started a CBD propagation program, where we have identified high CBD strains. Then provided those strains to trusted growers who are now growing them out, so that we make sure that we have high CBD medicine available for patients with really grave diseases. Cancers, for example, can respond especially well to high CBD strains.

# That is very interesting. Can you tell our readers more about why it is important to have high CBD strains rather than just medicine that is high in THC?

Steve – Sure, I would be happy to. Much of the most exciting new research that has come out about the efficacy of medical cannabis in recent few years is evidence about the effect that CBD has on tumors. CBD has a potent antitumor effect, and there have now been studies of various cancers, skin cancers and breast cancers, all which have demonstrated that CBD has the ability to slow down, stop or possibly reverse tumor growth. So this is hugely exciting information and we, for that reason, want to make sure that we have high CBD strains available so that we supply it to our most gravely ill patients. In addition to cancer, there are a number of other diseases that apparently respond very well to CBD, and they are often life threatening illnesses. So by having high CBD strains of cannabis available, and by being able to identify them as such, I

think that we actually are going to be able to save quite a considerable number of lives in the next couple of years.

### That's excellent. Now, about your name — what is the meaning behind Harborside?

Steve - Look out the window!

#### Oh, are we near a harbor here?

Steve - Well, you know, what I noticed about the names of dispensaries is that too many dispensaries were named various different acronyms. You know, combinations of letters that stood for the organizations that they were but very often people wouldn't refer them by those names, they would refer them by a location that they were in. So, you know, instead of calling something the Berkeley Patients Group they would call it, "The San Pablo Club". Or instead of the CARE dispensary they would say, "You know the one across from the police station", and I didn't want people to call this place the freeway club. So I said to myself, how am I going to avoid that happening? I needed to choose a name, which somehow refers to the location, because that's what people always naturally do, but I somehow wanted to control that naming process more. I also thought that because from the very beginning what I wanted to do was create something that was some kind of a model, something that could possibly be replicated elsewhere, I wanted something that had some kind of universal feel to it. I was thinking about what kind of place I wanted to create, but the words that kept coming back to me were safe harbor. I wanted to create some kind of safe harbor for people to come to. I wanted a place where people can get shelter from the storm, where they can come and get the supplies that they need, and that's what a harbor is. So it seemed to me that Harborside would be a name that really, you could take to places that weren't anywhere close to a harbor, because the harbor is the dispensary itself. So I thought it was a name that was expandable.

## Any difficulties? What kind of troubles have you run into since you've been open?

Steve - Lots of small trouble, I'd say. You know, the most threatening thing that happened to us was when our landlady received a letter from the DEA, threatening to seize this property unless she evicted us. It was a very scary time, lots of dispensaries had gotten letters and many people were evicted as a result of that. Fortunately, our landlady is a woman of great conviction and moral strength, and she decided that she was not going to act out of fear, she was going to act out of conviction. She allowed us to remain open, at obviously great risk to herself. So we were very fortunate that we had cultivated a positive relationship with her, and that she stood by us. That was probably the scariest thing that happened. When we first opened we had some roque police officers that started pulling over patients and harassing them, making our patients empty out their bags of medicine, putting them on the hoods of their cars. There was this one cop who was taking pictures of the medicine with his iPhone and then he would berate patients and tell them that these places were nothing but a scam, but then do nothing and send the patient on their way after detaining them for 30 minutes, putting them through all of this torture. This happened several times before I was able to get the IDs of the officers who were involved. Once I got that ID I contacted the Oakland Police Department command structure and explained to them the problem. Almost immediately those problem officers were transferred out of the district and I never had a problem with them again.

There are little things too, we've never had any type of serious security incident here, but one night we did have a call and my cell phone went off. The alarm company was calling me and telling me the alarm was going off. When I came up here I found that one of our front windows had been smashed in with a rock, I went in and no one was there. I looked at the security tapes and it was just some kids who had thrown a rock through the window. They were probably trying to grab the computer monitor or something. By the time I got there we just found pictures of them running away. Little things; we had a couple that brought a domestic dispute into the parking lot. Nothing major. We have had operational challenges as we grow, and we've grown very rapidly. We are now serving around 700 patients a day at this facility. So we've had to continually expand our parking facilities. I've had to continually recruit and train staff. We had to develop line management mechanisms, add more cash registers. Just generally keep on growing. It's been challenging, but no real problems.

#### What is currently going on with the laws and how will these changes impact you in the future?

Steve - There is a lot of talk right now in various different jurisdictions — including Oakland — about different steps forward, different ways this could go. There are conversations about centralized large-scale production and figuring out a way to move cannabis cultivation from an unlicensed arena into a more licensed and regulated arena.

I think that's something that's coming down the road eventually. There is discussion about potentially opening more dispensaries within the City of Oakland, so that could possibly happen. It might not, nobody really knows at this stage of the game. We do have the tax and regulate initiative that's on the ballet. If that passes, the City of Oakland is going to have the option of regulating and taxing adult cannabis sales. I think it will probably take the city a little while before they feel comfortable doing that. We learned from the passage of prop 215 in 1996; until 2004, the city of Oakland, like every other jurisdiction in California, did not regulate medical cannabis dispensaries.

Oakland, of course, was the first to regulate in 2004, but you have a few years that went by there. So my guess is that even if the initiative wins, we're still looking at a couple years before Oakland would really move to bring adult sales into the taxed arena, but it could happen guicker. If  $\triangleright$ 







that happens, I think that probably given the track record of success that Oakland has had with medical cannabis dispensaries, they would continue to allow those dispensaries to be the outlets for legal cannabis sales, simply allow us to start admitting all adult Californians as opposed to just those with a medical recommendation.

### What are your plans in the future? Any new projects or anything like that?

Steve – Yeah, we have all kinds of things that we are working on for the future. As I mentioned, our primary care clinic is something that is very exciting that's coming down the pike. We are also working on a major revamping of our website so that we have an interactive menu. That will give patients the options to get a huge amount of information about their cannabis before they buy it, like the genetic lineage of the plant, the analytical test result, a growers report, a photo gallery, be able to access other patients comments about that strain of cannabis, be able to compare the various different strains of cannabis on a chart so you can see what the price is versus the test results and they will be able to make a quick analysis. They will be able to pre-order their medicine online so that they would be able to come in, and there would be a special pickup section, so they won't have to wait so long for their medicine. We're working on an iPhone App so that patients can check in and see what's available at the dispensary from their iPhone.

# That's excellent! Thanks again for taking your time to talk with us today. I am sure a good number of our readers will really enjoy hearing about your dispensary from the inside.

After a quick check of my medical documentation, I was given a clipboard with various documents for me to both read over and sign. There were various things about my health and the symptoms I treat with cannabis, as well as instruction on how patients are supposed to conduct themselves and other good general information. Once I was done, they went over everything in detail and asked me if I had any questions. I didn't, so the next step was a We went all around the dispensary and they showed me each and every service they provide. There were really a number of great things a person could come to do at Harborside, as well as obtain plants and medicine. Speaking of plants, I must say they had the best clone section I have ever seen. Everything was properly labeled and there was a huge variety of top-notch genetics available to any patient with the knowledge. Each plant looked healthy and the people working knew a great deal about how they grow and what would be good for different situations. I was blown away. As far as the medicine, I have to say it was very good but compared to some of the medicine we get in here in Hollywood, I was not sure everything was really top quality. The huge difference was the testing. They had THC percentages for a good number of their strains, with the prices not really being indicative of the THC content. One thing we do know is there





are no molds or anything else harmful in this medicine and that's worth more to some people than anything. Seems like they have a hard time keeping the absolute best medicine around with the huge number of patients they take care of. All in all I got some excellent Blue Cheese and some Huckleberry Kush that were both a little expensive but well worth it. The hash they had needs work, I am sad to say, but they did have a couple varieties and some really rare and nice solvent extraction hashes. Their bubble hash was definitely much better than their oil/wax/budder selection. Some of their Full Melt was definitely very good and seemed to turn mostly to liquid. I saw they had a number of other things like edibles and tinctures, all of which looked very impressive and excellent tasting. I am sure any patient would be completely happy with their visits to Harborside, and I look forward to making the trip again.



# The folks at OGF

I recently had the positive opportunity to meet John Young and Jim Klahr from Oregon Green Free in Portland, Oregon. John is "Mr.Fixit" on the OGF forums.

e helps with OGF through management skills, knowledge of horticulture and just by being a down to earth good guy. Jim is one of the three Chief Petitioners for I-28, the lead chairman for ACMM, a cannabis court expert and a chairman on the board of OGF. Jim is the formal part of OGF; his joining OGF kicked it into gear and began the snowball effect to what OGF is today. OGF is hopeful for I-28. If passed, this bill will allow the establishment of medical marijuana supply systems, assistance and research programs, which would allow limited selling of marijuana. If I-28 passes, Jim sees more legal and less illegal growing — and more patients getting the proper medicine. Through desperation and need, people will go through too much to try to get proper medicine. Through the proper work, OGF has established a friendly relationship with the local law enforcement.

They are proud to say that police will point people their way. They have had new members come to them because of police telling them they should go to OGF. If I-28 passes, a new non-profit Oregon medical marijuana program resource center could open, which could provide more services through grants, car washes, raffles, parties and selling medicine.

Oregon Green Free started April 1, 2002. John and Karla – the founders of OGF – were chatting with a doctor at the clinic. They noticed an elderly couple and that the women had received a certificate to use medical marijuana. The couple were leaving with grow books and a look of confusion. They by no means were going to be able to grow proper medicine. John and Karla saw the need and decided to do something about it. OGF was born then and there. This led to handing out clones from their van in a local Safeway parking lot — and people joining their forces. Later would come meetings and getting together for picnics with medical tents for patients, to "smokeNbowl", a private bowling event where shy and brave, old and young, members in wheelchairs, vibrant and not-so-vibrant gathered. Yet, they all had one thing in common: all were "like minded people coming out to have a good time." OGF meetings are open to the public; they invite all to come and learn.



OGF has 14 chapters throughout Oregon state. OGF has a public meeting daily attempting to educate the public and bring the community together. At the Portland chapter, you can enter after showing a proper ID.

You first enter into the Social room and see tables, couches, and an educating platform. Display cases are full of hand-blown glass from a member, and computers for Internet access.

Located near homes, you would never know what is happening behind these doors. The building looks like an old warehouse, but it serves its purpose. OGF is presently looking for new digs.

While inside, you might catch a glimpse of Black Jack and other proper gear to grow your own medicine. OGF is proud of its members' knowledge base! They teach the basics: down-to-earth, simple and true.



# Robert Willy Neron

Robert Willy Neron has Hodgkin's disease which is bad enough but during some Chemo treatments it burnt his heart and lung leaving him with only one lung partially working. Imagine life with half a heart and half a lung! His brother actually passed from this same illness, so when I say that he has a medical need it's a severe understatement. Hodgkin's disease, is a type of lymphoma

It was named after Thomas Hodgkin <a href="http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Thomas\_Hodgkin">http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Thomas\_Hodgkin</a>, who first described abnormalities in the lymph system in 1832. Basically cancer of the immune system. He was diagnosed in 2004 and unfortunately he has



the really bad Non lymphoma type with a very low rate of survival.

Originally he received his Cannabis exemption for cervical dystonia spasmodic retrocolis. Basically involuntary muscle spasm of the neck shoulders and back, which he initially received from a work related injury while working in a plywood mill. Robert feels all the pills he was fed eventually made him develop cancer due to the extreme stress associated with the loss of income and lost of mobility all the time being doped up on pharmaceuticals. His favorite strain is Willy Jack but in particular a special clone from Willy Jack himself.

Here is an Interview I did with Fdrlxmt;

### SUB: Should I use your real name or stick with the nick?

ROB: My name is Robert Neron and on internet my name is fdrlxmt ( federal exemptee) But my friends call me " Willy ".

#### SUB: What condition do you have?

ROB: I suffer from Cervical Dystonia Spamodic Retrocolis and in 2004 i have been diagnosed with Hodgkin Disease Non Lymphoma.

#### SUB: How does it affect you physically?

ROB: It a life changing disability suffering from intense muscle spasms in the neck shoulder back area. It was first described as Torticolis. But mine just won't go away. So I have had to re learn how to do many things that I



then took for granted like riding a bicycle or going fishing in my canoe..Which I can no longer can do.

Then cancer came along...I presume all the pills I was then taking must have triggered it along with the unreal amount of stress I had at the time in my life.

#### SUB: What benefits do you receive form cannabis.?

ROB: I was happy to have cannabis in my life when before I was injured , since 12 year old. So I knew the quality marihuana had and when I saw I wasn't going to get any better and that all them pills were making me sicker by the day ,I opted for the natural way. Marihuana relieved some of the pain associated with muscle spasms , making the spasms less intense.

When I received A,B,V,D Chemo , I dint need any of the pills for nausea, so I dint take them . I had an appetite and helped make bad days into somewhat better days. When I received Radiation Therapy, there again it helped me eat and kept the food down.( no nausea).

# SUB: When did you first get your 56 status and once you did have you had any problems with its application or the cops?

ROB: I started my fight in January 1998, I have had to take health Canada 9 times to Federal Courts System. I represented my own self as lawyer an WON 7 times. The only two time i lost was when we ask for the rights to import / export of course we were denied and i lost when we asked for concentrations like butter, hash, oil ect that too we were denied.

I have had to fight every step of the way for my exemption and it would apear i would have to re do it all over again.

#### SUB: Can you tell me more about your Exemption?

ROB: Well this is a big controversy as none of the exemptees in Canada have the same permit. There is no equity, meaning whats good for you can and should also be good for me. So if you have 30 grams a da....well, that what every one should have..." Equity "But thats far from the case sub. you start at 5 grams a day then slowly move up.I was the first canadian to break all them records.I had a very suportive Dr at the time wich made it somewhat easyer.Eventually i ended up at 73 plants a day an in a letre sent to health canada on july 1st 2007 demanding a unlimited amount of plant..exemption.

For security reason we do not talk about personal amount ect...it tends to attract thieves and rip-offs.

But I was the first one to get the biggest exemptions at the time.

#### SUB: Whats your fav day strain and night strain


ROB: Every one knows  $\operatorname{Im}$  a " Willy " kind of  $\operatorname{guy}$ , day or night.


#### SUB: What's your favorite way to ingest?

ROB: It used to smoke my joint like everyone else, but following all the health issues I have had to deal with , I now eat 2 grams of oil a day and vaporize about 4 to 5 grams of kief a day. I smoke about 1 to 2 joints a day.

ROB: Like i said i now eat 2 grams of oil a day ,i take em in gel caps ( size 00 ).I use to do medible but now with my radiated stomach its more difficult to eat it.  $\triangleright$


As I got to know him better by reading his post and hanging out with him in the chat room I grew fond of his love of my favorite plant and I asked him if he would care to try one of my more potent sativas Jacks Cleaner 2, and he agreed to do so. He also has some unusual ideas about growing, some of which have some surprising results. I was surprised to read he removes a large majority of his fan leaves from his plants and from look-

> ing at his amazing online thread it certainly looks like his yields were amazing to me. I have always thought that the fan leaves were the fuel tanks for the buds. I only remove just enough to allow better light to the lower buds but at least from the pictures I cannot see a reduction in bud size. I plan on doing my own test to see if there is a huge difference. Fdrlxmt stated he is growing buds not leaf and he feels the leaf just gets in the way. I like the way he thinks but I will have to

look into his method and do some side by side testing.

The other practice I found unusual is the amount of stress he puts the young plants under in order to force any possible herm traits to show early. Now almost any plant can be made to herm with stress I have seen firsthand female clones that do fine in other gardens throw bunches of male flowers due to the stress of my hot soil. But this method does eliminate any un-desirable plants early and I am happy that he was able to find a female plant out of the pack of seeds that had no problems and that he deemed a permanent keeper. Again initially I was thrown off by his method but as I watched his amazing grow thread unfold it was clear he knew what he was doing and there is merit in his method. Robert went on to also grow out our Deep Purple strain and we are honored he would try some of our gear.

I wanted to tell this brief story about this medical Marijuana Patient so that people will understand how insane it is to deny anyone relief from a condition like Roberts. Some days I wish the law makers were confined to Roberts' chair. 🍨







Jaime is the founder and breeder of Resin Seeds. He has been active in the grow scene of Spain since 1998, when he opened one of the first grow shops of Spain in Barcelona. Since then he has been involved in the Spanish grow scene, participating and various grow shop projects and as speaker in grow seminars.

On Sunday 27th January 2008, the strain Cannatonic of Resin Seeds won the 3rd prize in the Sativas category at the 21st High Times Cannabis Cup in Amsterdam.

The real surprise though came during the Spannabis fair in Barcelona 2009, at the stand of CANNA, 2 different sample of Cannatonic tested high on THC and CBD. An amazing result considering that expensive pharmaceutical products like Sativex© have this 1:1 ratio between THC:CBD - a ratio very difficult to find in Cannabis where the biochemestry of the plant pushes to either have a THC or CBD domaniant variety. Jaime was indeed looking for a medicinal strain and Cannatonic turned out to be the real queen of CBD!

#### **Genetics**

Cannatonic represents the best of both worlds, a phenotype selected from the hybrid cross between a female MK Ultra (F1) & the all time famous G13 Haze male. Grows like an Indica, smells like a Sativa, and renders


#### What is CBD?

Cannabidiol (CBD) is a major, non psychotropic constituent of cannabis. It has been shown to cause numerous physiological effects of therapeutic importance.

Its exact chemical structure was elucidated by Dr. Mechoulam and Dr. Shvo.

In the last 15 years we have had a remarkable increase in number of scientific publications on CBD, mainly stimulated by the discovery of its anti-inflammatory, anti-oxidative and neuroprotective effects.;

CBD has an extremely safe profile in humans, and it

has been clinically evaluated (albeit in a preliminary fashion) for the treatment of anxiety, psychosis, and movement disorders. There is good pre-clinical evidence to warrant clinical studies into its use for the treatment of diabetes, ischemia and cancer.

#### In which Cannabis plants and products do we find CBD?

Most of the varieties of industrial hemp, from which we extract natural fiber and seeds for food products, are CBD dominant and contain an average 4%CBD / 0.3%THC

Most Cannabis consumed in the recreational market is THC dominant, meaning that it ranks high in THC and very low in CBD (on average 12% THC / 0.2% CBD). Breeders efforts to increase the THC content of their varieties have left CBD (not dominant) down to very low levels.

In hashish, especially the one made in the Himalayas and Morocco, CBD is usually present in concentrations that are equal and sometimes superior than the ones of THC (I.e 12%THC / 11%CBD). This is due to the fact that hashish is made by extracting the resin from a large population of plants, which have grown outdoors from mixed seeds THC dominant plants are harvested and dried together with CBD dominant plants. During the extraction process the extracted resin from all plants is mixed together - therefore bringing both cannabinoids in the final product.

More recently new varieties that contain both THC and CBD in high concentration in the same flower have been reported. In particular the variety Bediol, available in pharmacies in the Netherlands, which contains an average 6% THC and 7.5% CBD and the variety Cannatonic, from the Spanish seedbank Resin Seeds with 6.9%THC and 6.2%CBD, as tested by CANNA research at Spannabis 2009 .







utch cheese, the milk cheese, enjoys worldwide popularity, well-known as a superior product. When a seed bank like Dutch Passion aims at breeding cannabis genetics that shall bear this traditional trade mark name, it faces the challenge to live up to that high standard associated with Dutch cheese, to make Dutch Cheese, the cannabis strain, a new quality standard itself. No wonder that Dutch Passion reports on the breeding process of Dutch Cheese: "For the creation of Dutch Cheese (60% sativa, 40% indica) our breeders took the best cheese genetics and crossed them with various other strains. We were looking for the 'perfect match', where two stable strains can be crossed to give a new variety that improves on both of the parents." That 'perfect match' then was found in Dutch Passion's own Euforia strain, a potent and high yielding Skunk selection that is a personal favorite of some of the Dutch Passion team. According to Dutch Passion, "the crossbreeding with Euforia has not compromised the cheesy qualities at all. But it has given improved potency and significant yield improvements, growing to a height of 60-80cm with lots of sticky side buds that show some internodal spacing that will help prevent bud rot/mould - an important feature for a heavyyielding variety." Dutch Cheese is suitable for indoor and greenhouse cultivation, it finishes flowering within 8-10 weeks, under natural light ripening in the second half of October.

The famous Cheese genetics that were used by Dutch Passion for creating Dutch Cheese date back to 1988/89, it was a special genotype of Skunk #1 that had been selected by a grower in South East England. This special Skunk plant had big buds and a cheesy sweet aroma and was maintained as a clone that was called "Cheese". This clone was spreaded all over England in the 90ies, gaining a big deal of popularity. It was UK breeder Big Buddha who brought the Cheese genetics to worldwide prominence then in the middle of the next decade, by having bred Big Buddha Cheese which was genetically very close to the original Cheese plant, but refined with Afghan landrace genetics.

The grower "Greenhouse Joe" put a whole bag of 10 feminised Dutch Cheese seeds to the test. Contrary to what his name is associated with, he grew them indoors, under a 400 watts high pressure sodium lamp. They had to share the growing area with six other plants grown from feminised seeds.

Germination of the ten Dutch Cheese seeds was super fast, setting a new record never experienced before by Greenhouse Joe - within 48 hours, all of them had successfully sprouted! So they seemed to be extremely viable and the grower was looking forward to a great cultivation cycle. After a few days, he transplanted the young seedlings to 7.5 litre pots filled with Plagron Standard Mix soil. They were illuminated by four 36 watts fluorescent lights - one half with cool white, the other with warm white spectrum - in the first two weeks, then Greenhouse Joe replaced them with a 400 watts high pressure sodium lamp suitable for both the vegetative and flowering stage. They spent four weeks in the vegetative stage, with a daily light period of 18 hours. ⊳





Vegetative growth was excellent, the ten Dutch Cheese plants thrived very well, turning out to be very homogeneous also. They produced indica typical dark green and quite broad leaves, but had a more open canopy (while they still were quite compact) and significantly more and longer side branches than a pure indica when flowering was induced by Greenhouse Joe after four weeks by reducing the light period to 12/12. The height of the plants was between 70 and 85 cm at that point of time. They already gave off a strong spicy smell that was omnipresent in the grow room.

In the course of flowering, certain differences in height became more noticeable, but almost all of the plants had a very similar growth and flowering pattern, producing a thick main cola surrounded by several well-developed side tops in the medium and lower zones of the plants. They had a very high calyx-to-leaf ratio for the most part, with the top colas exhibiting particularly few flower leaves. Bud formation was dense and tight, much more reminding of indica than sativa. All the plants produced excellent or even abundant amounts of resin, while some of them were especially white and sticky. That trade mark cheesy smell was present on all of the plants and extremely powerful in the end. Also, the ten Dutch Cheese plants had proven to be 100% female, there wasn't any male flower at all. They measured between 95 and 115 cm in height on the first harvest day, when after 56 days the first five plants were stripped down. The other five were harvested within five more days. Against the background of 8-10 flowering weeks stated by Dutch Passion, that flowering time of 8-8.5 weeks was a fast finishing flower result for Dutch Cheese.

Weighing the carefully dried Dutch Cheese buds revealed that each plant had yielded 33 grams on the average, resulting in a total of 330 grams. Together with the yield of the six plants of the other feminised strain grown on that area, the outcome was more than 500 grams from 1.2 sq metres - certainly an excellent result for plants grown from seed.

The buds had a great cheesy and skunky aroma and taste, but produced

quite a mild delicious smoke. The onset of the THC effect was very quick and mighty, emerging into a longlasting strong high that covered the whole spectrum, providing both an intense cerebral sativa flash and a certain deal of indica stonedness that was increasing in the second half of the high.

When I first started entering in the High Times Cannabis Cup, there were very few Goddess's in the group, now there are even Miss High Times, and many have now had the chance to wear that title.





Women are natural healers and men too, but women are softer, and have a glow about them that is very attractive.


As far as photography is concerned I would always rather take pictures of cannabis plants with beautiful women behind them than men.



## **Product Review**



## ...The History of Trimmers

rimpro has become the industry standard for leaf trimmers worldwide. Indeed, when one thinks of trimmers, the name that immediately comes to mind is Trimpro. But how did this all happen?

Pierre Mercier, whose experience as a machinist at a company that made turbine engines, inspired him to create the first Trimpro Original and found the company. He had been asked by a friend to try to develop a machine that could separate the leaves from plants with minimal damage to the delicate flowers. After a couple of unsuccessful experiments, he came up with the idea of creating a vacuum effect, like a turbine, under a grate so the leaves would be gently pulled through the slots where a spinning blade just below the surface of the grate would cut the leaves off, leaving the flower on the surface. Prototypes were made and introduced to a distributor based in Eastern Canada by the name of Biofloral. The owner, François Deguire, immediately realized the potential of the product and agreed to take on the task of marketing and distributing Trimpro products. The acceptance and demand from consumers was greater than anticipated, forcing Pierre to move production from his garage to a machine shop with offices and storage. The company was moved to just outside Montreal, Canada and remains in the same location.

Patents were secured in Canada and the United States, with Pending status in Europe and Australia. Andre Mercier, Pierre's brother, joined the company to continue to expand its scope of sales. He was living in Barcelona at the time and travelled throughout the country, as well as other parts of Europe, and quickly picked up on the specific requirements of the region. To respond to the demands from European growers, a plant trimmer based on the same principal as the Trimpro, but smaller, was introduced to the market. It was called the Trimbox.

Soon after, enhancements were made to each machine to meet the particular demands of customers. The Workstations for both the Trimpro and Trimbox were introduced, resulting in four machines available to meet most trimming styles, but the continuous effort to improve did not stop.

They realized there was a requirement for a more productive and safer piece of equipment, so they started the development of the second generation of trimmers. The focus was to design a machine requiring less manipulation by the operator. A circular hermetic structure was added on top of the grate, creating a whirlwind effect. Adding a stronger motor and a second set of the famous Trimpro blades created enough wind for the plants to move on the













surface of the grate while the leaves were pulled through the slots and trimmed — the same concept as the original Trimpro. In 2006, this novel machine called the Automatik was introduced with great market acceptance.

It wasn't long before requests to produce a higher volume Automatik machine were being received from growers. This led to the development and production of the largest Trimpro presently on the market, the **XL**. Again, a more powerful motor and extra set of blades were required, as well as a redesign of the grate. The results were spectacular, with immediate acceptance in the North American and Australian markets, Europe not being far behind.

Innovation is at the cornerstone of Trimpros success. In 2009, the Gasoline model was added to the line. Made for growers who prefer to work outdoors, the machine employs a 1.3 hp Honda gas motor with the Automatik technology.

In their continuing efforts to meet the requests of their customers, they will be introducing another new machine this year — the **Trimpro Rotor**. The design deviates from the traditional Trimpro but displays the same pride and engineering. The plants are gently rotated over the grate by



leather fingers and trimmed by the razor sharp Trimpro blade system. This machine compliments the Automatik by using a different technique to move the flowers on top of the grate.

The success of the Trimpro product line is based on the fact that they are simple, efficient and durable machines. When introduced, they responded to a real market need, as, apart from scissors, there were really no other products available to growers. By constantly improving upon the original model through innovation, Trimpro has succeeded in building an excellent reputation, one that is the envy of their competitors. This is backed up by their excellent after sales service and warranty.

Trimpro has grown from a concept to an established company employing more than 20 people in their shop and offices. Proudly made in Canada, the Trimpro line of trimmers are simply the best on the market.







## BEST STONER STORY TO DAT

AUTHOR T.A. SEDLAK has been making his rounds to stoner circles nationwide to promote his new novel, Anarcho Grow. He's already traveled from coast to coast this year for marijuana events, concerts, and readings, with more stops still planned in Denver, Seattle, Portland, OR, and Boston. If you haven't caught him yet, look out for him in the future. He could be the next big marijuana celebrity.

Sedlak's novel, Anarcho Grow, is set in Costa Rica where the main character had done volunteer work in a small village during college. He later returns, thinking he can help the people more through other means, and introduces them to guerrilla growing. The community begins secretly cultivating in the rain forest, and the money rolls in as they transport the grass to the United States by catamaran boat. However, the C.I.A. soon catches wind and heads down to check in on the operation.



Anarcho Grow is an intriguing read. First off, it's fast paced. The rhythm is quick, like a Talib Kweli rhyme, and the diction is simple, like the spare, tightly written prose of Hemingway. After two chapters, you're hooked and won't put it down until it's finished. The reading experience lasted two days for me, five hours each day.

Secondly, though fiction, it's evident that everything in Anarcho Grow could happen. Sedlak's of the school that believes fiction should mirror reality. And because of this, there isn't a point where readers say, "Yeah, right," and roll their eyes. Lastly, while marijuana is at



the center of the story, the book's extremely intelligent. T.A. doesn't spend pages rambling about what it feels like to be high, he doesn't create one dimensional, pothead characters who talk slowly and giggle. Instead, he uses marijuana culture, which he's been fully immersed in for more than half his life, to teach readers about different societies, political philosophies, and other topics associated with high-grade literature. And that's why Anarcho Grow has drawn hefty praise from former High Times editor, Steve Bloom, countless marijuana industry magazines, and even famous intellectuals, like Howard Zinn and Noam Chomsky. It is the best stoner story to date.



We used the internet this year to spread this event information to as many people as possible. We used social networking sites to invite people, and educate them on the medicinal benefits of medical marijuana. We attempted to send out a press release to the major media outlets, but they all failed to print anything about the event. So instead, we used the opportunity to comment on their stories and posted the event info there. Any story that pertained to MJ or health issues, we took the time to comment about the event in their section.



#### **Second Goal: GET MORE PEOPLE IN OUR GROUP TO SHOW UP!**

Last year there was only a total of four people that we could gather to the GMM. Since we only had a few days notice, we cut our friends some slack. e return this issue to tell the story of the newly renamed THC Expose, the wonderful event that happened this past April in Los Angeles California. Previously, not even a year before, the first attempt at this Expo took place at the LA Convention Center. Since then due to a difference of opinion, the people who put on that original show had parted ways and it was possible it would not return. Despite the problems, there was a new show created inspired by the last, and it would be called the THC Expose. So many companies were excited since the other similar show was such a huge success, and just recently the smaller Hemp show was also very popular, leaving all the vendors very happy. Everyone assumed it would be another great show with more vendors and hopefully more enjoyment for the attendees.

The first day was a Friday and it ended on Sunday, we arrived early to find out that the show had a special crew who was building everything and setting everything up. We foolishly allowed them to help us only to find out later it would cost us a pretty penny. No worries, the show looked promising. There was an age restriction this year, but that meant no "adults" section. There were a good number of vendors, more than the prior shows, and some showed up in just as large a fashion as before. Still a good number also were much smaller than last time, if they even showed up at all, so that was interesting right away. There was also a noticeable randomness to how the booths were arranged, although some general areas did have a small attempt at organization. Some new cool things were introduced, and they really were great ideas.

There was a relaxation area, and this was a great idea, but it cost extra to go in. Not really worth paying anything extra, but a nice idea I guess. This seemed like less than 25% as many people as were at either of these other shows, and THIS show was a less expensive ticket price with far more vendors and a much bigger location. It made no sense, and was a shock for everyone. Almost without saying, you can imagine how poorly this whole event was going to go.

The next couple days would be basically the same, with the Saturday being the most popular day by far. When celebrities showed up, there was a bit of pandemonium, but for the most part it was just the booths that featured them that got any attention at all, and I hear they even expected much more. There was something about a Jack Herer memorial and a Cannabis Cup competition that also took place around the same time, so I suppose a good number of people were attending those if you want to give the benefit of the doubt. Still for our booth and all the vendors we spoke to, it was a depressing event. People had spent huge money with many not feeling like they got what they had paid for. Not many of the vendors were making many sales, and even some of the people who had done really well at the previous shows were having a good bit of trouble at this one. The bottom line, people didn't attend like before, and it was up to speculation as to why not. There were plenty of vendors and the show looked fine with plenty more than the other shows, but I guess people just didn't hear about it or they decided it wasn't worth attending. That Hemp show was so well advertised, everywhere in the city there were signs and virtually everyone anywhere remotely close was bombarded with advertisement for the show, for many people that seemed to be the big difference.

The highlights of the THC Expose for me were the same big names as usual. Advanced Nutrients showed up with a bigger than life display, and so many employees all there to help explain their products and help their loyal customers. They gave away buttons and the winners made money yet again. Then there was Greenhouse who showed up with a huge display of clothing and promotion. There was a nutrient company from Humboldt and a number of glass pipe manufacturers, all looking good. did was to separate the Indica's from the Sativas which were already divided on the main list so all we needed to do was to match up the numbers to the types. We took out the most familiar things which are quite common in Holland, this included the Amnesias, the Cheeses, the Power Plants and Skunks. What we were left with was a small sampling of some interesting things. On the indica side we found a couple of really nice kushes, an SFV type thing and something else that had a similar OG smell. On the sativa side there were not too many samples that stood out. One was the AMG while the other was Sour Diesel from our friend Karma. At the event we check out what the strains were as they being verdamped in Evert's vaporizer's. The standout of all the entries was not even a bud it was a piece of bubble hash (see pictures). This hash was special, it came from a kush as the OG smell was really prevalent when you burned the hash, but we had no idea wher it came from. For us it truly was the best in show.

The event is always nice because its held in the summer and this year the weather was spectacular. We et up with Karma and his crew in Amsterdam and they would follow us in the huge van they rented as we headed out to the party. Karma showed up with his whole crew who are a wicked bunch of guys. They all had these black tins filled with killer dank buds. Karma had just done a selection so we go to try a bunch of things like his jack-onesia. One of my favorites strains that he has is his Happy Brother an old Dutch Indica, so I was quite happy when he whipped out the tin with the Brother. Karma even brought the Karma Gentics bong out to play.

The night started off pretty chilled out as we got a huge table right in front of the church which is a central point in Ruigoord. We blazed out and the they started serving some treats from the barbecue. The only thing lacking was in the dessert department, as a smoker you notice the lack of sweets. All in all it was a pretty old school chilled out party.

Ed Rosenthal was there, dressed up as a marine captain and adorned in cannabis leaves as he presented the prod-



uct awards. During this part of the evening they also gave out the girl of the year award which was the strain Sensi Star from Paradise genetics. An always welcome smoke, having grown it out myself. One notable standout from the product awards was the 00 box from spain. This is an awesome storage box ranging from huge humidor style boxes to small portable ones. They all have a screen and make some great hash, I know first hand as I've had the pleasure of meeting the inventor in Spain at Spannabis and he let us puff some of his stash. After this came the actual High Life cup where the awards were handed out for best cannabis strains.

I like awards shows as it is a way for the growers and breeders to get some recognition for their work. In this case one standout amongst the winners was the third prize for haze Hydro, the AMG. This strain is from a dutch breeder that I know who is also in the south of Holland called Ganjaman. The AMG is an old Haze called the MG that is crossed with an Amnesia. I had the pleasure of visiting his shop where he treated us to some AMG and showed us one of his giant trees that he is known for. Its hard to see but the tree in the photo is over 2.5 meters tall about 9-10ft. I needed a huge ladder to get some pics of the top.

Some of the other winners included a shop in Amsterdam called Ocean and one of my favorite shops outside of Amsterdam called the De Vrolijke Gaper, in a city called Gorinchem. They both won for Amnesia, but the Vrolijke Gaper won the overall High Life cup. It seems

that the Amnesia is by far one of the most awarded strains out there, and if you include their food line the Hy-pro guys have probably won close to 100 cups. I have to say having met the guys from Hypro not only do they have some great Amnesia but they also have one of the simplest, least expensive and best food lines out there. All in all it was a fun night and the party carried on till the wee hours of the night. We left a bit early and headed to Haarlem, a city near Amsterdam for a night cap of some of the finest gelato in Holland. A welcome treat after a night of puffing.





We made sure that everyone knew that Bill S-10 would cost Canadians billions of dollars, that it would split up families and that it would be locking up sick people. Most of the people who went by honked their horns in appreciation for our efforts while we only know of three people who didn't. All and all it was a good day of education for everyone and we look forward to the next time.
